"Freedom as I understand it …" Europe in the Realm between a New Awakening, Disillusionment and Threat

2023 marks the 30th anniversary of the foundation of Renovabis. On this occasion, the International Congress will take a look at the social and ecclesial developments in Central, Eastern and South-Eastern Europe over the past three decades, starting with the idea of freedom and the hopes and expectations associated with it at the beginning of the 1990s. It will cover a range from the initial spirit of optimism to increasing disillusionment and scepticism about Western models to the threat to freedom in Europe posed by authoritarian tendencies and the war against Ukraine. The congress will take stock of what has been achieved so far. It will also look at the challenges and tasks facing society, politics and the churches today and in the coming years, also in view of the changed geopolitical situation in Europe. In addition to lectures and panel discussions, a separate dialogue forum is planned for this purpose, which will give all participants of the congress the opportunity to actively contribute their topics, ideas and questions.

At the start of the Congress, on 12 September 2023, the solidarity initiative Renovabis will celebrate its 30th anniversary with a special festive event. Joachim Gauck, former German Federal President, will give the keynote speech. Afterwards, the Bavarian state government invites to a state reception. The evening offers the opportunity to meet and exchange informally.

International Congress Renovabis

The International Congress Renovabis, which has been held annually since 1997, serves to inform and discuss important developments in church and society in Central and Eastern Europe, but also takes up topics of pan-European importance. With the participation of numerous guests from all parts of Europe, the congress has developed into an important forum for dialogue between East and West.

Several dialogue groups will be formed according to topics/concerns, in which projects can be presented, discussion questions can be openly discussed and ideas can be further developed together with other participants of the Congress. Two dialogue rounds are planned, so that there is the possibility to participate in two different dialogue groups.

For organisational reasons, we would be grateful if you could enter your topics or questions for the Dialogue Forum in the space provided in the registration form. However, it is also possible to bring a dialogue topic to the congress itself. We also welcome impulses that arise on site.

The person who has proposed a topic takes an active and, if necessary, leading role in the dialogue group. The dialogue groups do not have to develop and present concrete results. However, important findings, topics and questions from the dialogue groups can be introduced at the final discussion on 14 September. Through these contributions, everyone will then be able to find out what the individual dialogue groups have been working on.

More detailed explanations on the procedure of the Dialogue Forum and assistance for the work of the dialogue groups will be given in the introduction during the congress.

Participation fees for presence participants

Those attending the congress in Munich in presence pay a flat rate of 80,- EUR for participation (including meals). Guests from Central and Eastern Europe pay half the fee, i.e. 40,- EUR. Certain groups of persons (students, etc.) can apply for a 50 percent reduction. A complete exemption from the participation fee is possible with a justified written application.

With the confirmation of registration you will receive the request to transfer the fee together with the necessary details.

Please note: In case of **cancellation of your registration** after 1 September, only 50 percent of any fees will be refunded. If you cancel after 8 September, no refund will be possible.
